

BUBBLE WAND INSTRUCTIONS



This recipe makes 1 gallon of bubble solution. I like to mix it in a recycled plastic milk carton. Use a funnel to avoid a mess!

These directions are open to variation. A lot depends on the size and age of the person using it. For smaller children, I recommend a dowel that is larger in diameter and shorter. I also recommend a shorter string.

Materials:

- <u>2 dowels</u>, 12" x 3/8 -1" (see info above)
- <u>Cotton rope or twine</u>, 4ft or more (kitchen twine works well)
- 2 <u>eye hooks</u> (to accommodate rope and dowel of choice)
- nut (to weigh down rope)



Directions

- Screw eye hooks into ends of dowels
- Cut cord to desired length
- Thread cord through eye hooks with nut inbetween dowels. Tie a knot.
- Dip in bubble solution to saturate string
- Start with dowels close together and slowly open while moving backwards.
- Bring dowels together to close off
- Be patient. It takes some practice but the results are worth it!

Note: It is important not to slosh the string around and create foam. For best results, you also need to be careful not to get the string tangled. Have fun!

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
